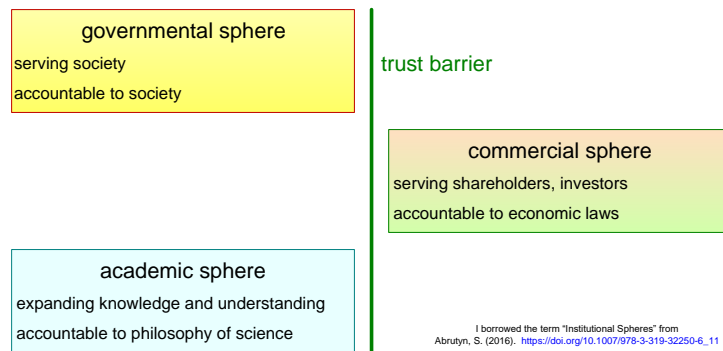


Figure 1: Institutional Spheres with Different Purposes and Accountabilities
